## COLONOSCOPY- STANDARD GOLYTELY BOWEL PREPARATION





## **Date & Location**

You should have received the date and location of your colonoscopy from our practice by phone, through the portal, and/or email and text messaging. If you do not know your procedure date or location, please contact our practice. Your procedure time will be communicated to you by the facility the day before your procedure.

# **Shopping List**

Our practice can provide a kit containing all over the counter medications needed for your colonoscopy, or you can purchase them over the counter:

- GoLYTELY (or generic name GaviLyte) prescription bowel preparation prescribed to your pharmacy
- □ Four (4) 5 milligram over the counter tablets of Dulcolax (or generic named bisacodyl)
- □ Four (4) 80 milligram over the counter tablets of simethicone or two (2) 250 milligram over the counter tablets of Phazyme



## **Medications**

If you take any of the following medications, please inform our scheduling staff as soon as possible so we can coordinate stopping these medications with your prescribing physician:

- □ **Blood thinners** including but not limited to Coumadin (warfarin), Plavix (clopidogrel), Xarelto (rivaroxaban), Eliquis (apixaban), Brilinta (Ticagrelor)
- ☐ **GLP1 medications** such as Trulicity (dulaglutide), Ozempic (semaglutide), Victoza (liraglutide), Bydureon (exenatide) used for diabetes or weight loss.



#### **Transportation**

Driving is not permitted until the day after your procedure. Arrange for a ride to and from the center from someone 18 or older who can take responsibility for your care. That person should arrive no later than 1 hour after your procedure time.



#### Cancellation/No-Show

Our practice charges \$100 for a colonoscopy and \$200 for a combined colonoscopy/EGD that is cancelled within 7 business days of the procedure. For patients who have canceled in the past, a \$100 refundable deposit will be taken to secure your appointment. The deposit will be refunded after your procedure is completed if your account is in good standing.

Immediately after this, drink the remaining half of the GoLYTELY mixture consuming 8 ounces every 15 to 20 minutes until completely gone. □ It is important that you complete all your assigned preparation no matter what color your stools are. □ A successful colonoscopy prep will result in clear to lemonade-colored stools; Please contact your endoscopy center at 7AM or later, on the day of your procedure if this is not the case after you have completed your preparation. □ Do not drink any liquids, chew gum or tobacco, or suck on hard candies for at least 3 hours prior to your arrival time. Do not smoke anything on the morning of your procedure. □ Please take your medications as prescribed EXCEPT for those listed below. Medicines must be taken at least 3 hours prior to your arrival time. Take insulin according to your PCP or endocrinologist instructions. □ Do not take diuretics (water/fluid pills), oral diabetic medications, iron pills, vitamins, or Carafate (sucralfate). If you have questions about what to take, please call us at least 1 business day before your arrival time. □ Bring a list of your current medications to your procedure
facility).  To cancel without incurring a fee, you must call our office at least 7 days before the procedure.		every 15 to 20 minutes. If you develop nausea, drink more slowly and try walking as you drink.    Save the remaining half for the next day.
